Know What You Believe & Why by David C. Mauldin

You should know what you believe and why. You should be able to define and explain your basic beliefs. (A good test is trying to explain them to a six-yearold!) I want to make sure you can. That's why this month I write about an essential truth all Christians cherish. This truth is mysterious and beautiful. I am talking about the doctrine of the Trinity.

The doctrine of the Trinity has a reputation for being difficult to understand. Not true! It is difficult to conceptualize. That is, you can't form a mental image of it. But it is not hard to understand. Allow me to take you on a guided tour. I hope by the end, you have a better understanding of the doctrine and a deeper appreciation for God. That's the point here: knowing God, worshipping God, and reveling in the beauty and love of God!

What is the doctrine of the Trinity? God is One in Being and Three in Person. Come again?

There is only one God, but God exists in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

In contrast, I am one in being and one in person. I am one what (a human being) and one who (David Mauldin). God is one what (God) and three whos (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit).

That seems odd to me because there is nothing else in my experience like that. Can you give me another

example?

No. God is utterly unique. No one and no thing is quite like God!

How did we arrive at this doctrine? Step 1: There is only One God. Deuteronomy 6:4 says, "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one." (ESV)

Step 2: Jesus is divine. He claimed to be God. He forgave sins. He accepted worship. In the stories he told, he consistently equated himself with Israel's God. He was condemned for blasphemy.
Step 3: Jesus is different from the Father. Jesus called God his Father. Jesus prayed to the Father. In one sense, Jesus and the Father are one (John 10:30), and yet they can be differentiated. They are the same God, but not the same person.

Step 4: The Holy Spirit is God, yet distinct from both the Father and the Son. For example, the Holy Spirit is distinct from Jesus, yet he is how Jesus is present with us.

So you see, we do not arrive at the doctrine of the Trinity by starting with philosophical reflections. We start with our experience of God as he has revealed himself. This leads us to the doctrine of the Trinity.

Why do we believe this doctrine?

Because we believe Jesus is fully human and fully divine. If Jesus is God, then you end up with the doctrine of the Trinity. If he is not, Christianity fails altogether.

Consider: If Jesus is God, then on the cross, God took your sins upon himself. If Jesus is not God, how would







his death help you? Even if he could bear your sins, God would be pushing them off on an innocent third party. How would that be just? Thus, for the cross to work, Jesus must be God.

Consider also: Jesus was condemned on a charge of blasphemy. If the Father raised him from the dead, that vindicates Jesus. He was who he claimed to be! Thus, if Jesus rose, he is God. If he did not, Christianity is bankrupt of all truth.

Where do we see the doctrine of the Trinity taught in the Bible?

As I said, all of Jesus' claims to divinity are relevant here. We can also point to numerous New Testament passages:

• Jesus told his disciples, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19 ESV)

• Paul gives a trinitarian blessing at the end of 2 Corinthians: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." (2 Corinthians 13:14 ESV)

• At the Last Supper, Jesus spoke of the three divine Persons in one sentence, "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever." (John 14:16 ESV) There are also indications in the Old Testament that

the One God is plural in Person:
The very first verse of the Bible mixes a plural noun with a singular verb: "In the beginning, God [the word God here is plural] created [the verb created is

singular] the heavens and the earth." (Genesis 1:1 ESV)
Later in Genesis 1, God speaks of himself in the plural: "Then God said. "Let us make man in our

the plural: "Then God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness." (Genesis 1:26 ESV)

• Even in Deuteronomy 6:4, there is an indication: "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one." The word one here is ehad in Hebrew. It refers to a composite one — for example, the one-flesh union of husband and wife or a cluster of grapes.

Of course, I don't have room here to give you more than just the tip of the iceberg. Suffice it to say, the doctrine of the Trinity is solidly biblical.

But the word Trinity is not in the Bible. Is that a problem?

No, because the concept is there. The doctrine is there. The word Trinity is simply a convenient label we put on it.

Do we have to use Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? Can't we substitute other words?

We use these words because they are the names God gave us. Jesus teaches us to call God our Father. Scripture teaches us many names for God: the Lord, God Most High, God who Hears, and more. Scripture gives us many images for God: our rock, our refuge, and more. The Holy Spirit is called the Comforter and the Counselor. Jesus is called the Prince of Peace and the Lion of Judah. We have many ways, therefore, to address God. When we define the Trinity, we want to be faithful to the words God has given us. God has revealed himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. That's why we use those words. They are his words, not ours.

Does the doctrine of the Trinity make any practical difference?

Absolutely! If the God who created us has made himself known, we want to know him rightly. Also, consider this: If God is triune, then God is love, as the Bible says he is. If God is strictly singular—One in Being and in Person—then love may be something God can do, but it cannot be who he is. Why? Because love requires two: One who loves and a beloved.

Because God is triune, God is love. The Father loves the Son and the Spirit. The Son loves the Father and the Spirit. The Spirit loves the Father and the Son. God is an eternal community of love. God does not have to create something in order to love. God is eternally perfect love. That's important—and a uniquely Christian understanding.

Bottom line:

Know truth. Love truth. Live truth. Share truth.

Know God. Love God. Delight in God. He is more beautiful and mysterious than you are capable of comprehending!




